Friends Welcome James H. Ottaway, Jr.

James H. Ottaway, Jr., distinguished journalist, publisher, and newspaper executive will deliver the seventh annual Dennis O'Keefe Memorial Lecture, sponsored by the Friends of the Sojourner Truth Library, at 5 p.m. on Thursday, September 19, in Coykendall Science Building Auditorium on campus. This event is free and open to the public and will be followed by light refreshments provided by Sodexo.

Ottaway will draw from his long career in journalism, which began when he first served as a reporter and associate editor of the *News-Times* of Danbury, CT. He later worked as a reporter and bureau chief, among other positions, for the *Times Herald-Record* (Middletown), as editor of the *Pocono Record* (Stroudsburg, Penn.) and as publisher of the New Bedford *Standard Times* (Mass.). He became President and Director of the Ottaway Newspapers in 1970, upon its merger with Dow Jones. In 2003, he retired as senior vice president of Dow Jones & Company, retiring from its Board of Directors three years later. He has also served as Chairman of the World Press Freedom Committee (Reston, Virginia).

Ottaway has long been affiliated with numerous philanthropic organizations, serving on the boards of Doctors without Borders, Human Rights Watch, the American School of Classical Studies (Athens), and the Wallkill Valley Land Trust. A trustee and chairman of the Storm King Art Center, he is also a life trustee of Bard College and chairman of the advisory board of its Institute for International Liberal Education.

The recipient of several honorary degrees, he and his wife, Mary Hyde Ottaway, have three children and live in New Paltz, where they are active members of the community. At SUNY New Paltz the James H. Ottaway Sr. Endowed Professorship is named in honor of Ottaway's father, the founder of the Ottaway Newspapers. The only distinguished professorship at the college, the Ottaway Fellows have included three Pulitzer Prize-winning journalists and two best-selling authors.



Meet Our New Databases

The library has subscribed to a number of new databases to further enhance our offerings of online materials. The following is a brief rundown:

Times Digital Archive

from 1785-2007 and is an excellent resource for primary



resources, from the French Revolution to today. It is a great source for the British perspective on all major world events, much like the *Historical New York Times* database is for the American perspective. The basic search allows users to quickly search the full text of the London Times, while the advanced search enables searching of specific sections in the newspaper. There is also the browse by date feature, which allows users to browse entire issues by publication date.

Art Index Retrospective

Art Index Retrospective covers 1929 to 1984, volumes 1-32 (which STL also has in print). The database cites articles from more than 420 periodicals published throughout the world. Subjects include: architecture and architectural history, archaeology, art history, decorative arts, folk art, interior design, photography, and museum studies.

Readers' Guide Retrospective

Indexes the most popular, general-interest periodicals published in the United States from 1890 to 1982 (STL also has the *Readers' Guide* in print).

UlrichsWeb

An international directory of approximately 210,000 current serial publications, including magazines, journals, annuals, irregular publications, and newspapers, as well as over 47,000 publications discontinued since 1979.

Gannett Newspapers Database

Provides access to over 85 Gannett newspapers, 6 of which are NY newspapers: Poughkeepsie Journal, Ithaca Journal, Democrat & Chronicle (Rochester), Journal News (White Plains), Press and Sun Bulletin
